Special Topics in Asian Art: Portraiture in Himalayan Buddhist Art

300-level in Non-Euro-American





One of the highly developed genres of Himalayan Buddhist art that corresponds (to an extent) with Euro-American artistic traditions is portraiture. This course will look at the development of portraiture in premodern and contemporary Himalayan art across media, including painting, sculpture, and photography. After grappling with theoretical accounts of portraiture in general, we will look at the functions and the conventions of portraiture in its Himalayan religious and socio-cultural contexts, paying special attention to the ways that align with and differ from other traditions of

portraiture, broadening its definition and questioning assumptions about universal values. Studies of specific portraits will be drawn from Central Tibet, Nepal, the Western Himalayas, and Tibetaninspired contexts in the Mongol and Manchu courts of China.
